April and May gave us excellent rain but unfortunately didn't continue into June and July. August was another great month receiving 66mm of rain, which turned the season around. In September we received half of our expected rainfall which has left us 30% down on average for the year.

Compared to many areas across the state we are very thankful for the rainfall we have received. The south east of the state is now desperate for rain and some recent frost events have caused significant damage in other areas.

We have recently started windrowing our Compass Barley. The windrowing
